What to ask instead of 'How was your day today?"

Congratulations!

Last week our school sent students out to compete in the local Kia-o-Rahi competition. Ki-o-Rahi is a traditional Māori team sport played on a circular field. Two teams, Kīoma and Taniwha, compete. The game is divided into quarters or halves, and teams switch roles (Kīoma or Taniwha) partway through the game. Here's how each team scores:

- **Kīoma** score by touching posts (**Pou**) with the ball (**Kī**), then running the Kī through a central area (**Te Roto**) and placing it down in a scoring zone (**Pawero**).
- **Taniwha** score by hitting a central target (**Tupu**) with the Kī. The Kīoma team has **Kaitiaki** (guardians) who try to stop the Taniwha from hitting the Tupu.

To prevent the other team from scoring, Taniwha will try to stop Kīoma players by ripping a tag off a player.

Our Chess Team also competed last week. All students had a great time thinking strategically and trying to outwit their opponents.

Finally, our Cross-Country team of six competed in Nelson. Congratulations to: Axel, Beau, Tor, Paige, Awen and Olivia. A special mention to Axel Walker who was the only senior student to qualify and compete at this level. All age groups had fields of about 60 students in them. Results were:




