FORMAL NOTICE OF STRIKE ACTION AND SCHOOL CLOSURE ON THURSDAY 23RD OCTOBER

Today, the primary school teachers' union, NZEI has formally issued notice of strike action scheduled to take place from 7:00am to 7:00pm on Thursday 23 October 2025.

This action will involve employees who are members of NZEI Te Riu Roa and are covered by the following collective agreements:

- Primary School Teachers' Collective Agreement
- Primary Principals' Collective Agreement
- Support Staff in Schools Collective Agreement (includes employees with the job title Guidance Counsellor)
- Area School Teachers' Collective Agreement
- Kaiārahi i te Reo and Therapists' Collective Agreement

The Board of Trustees of Lower Moutere has reluctantly decided to close on that day as we do not have enough non-unionised staff to safely supervise the students here at school. We regret any inconvenience that this action has caused.



EVOLOCITY

On Tuesday, it was time to put our two electric vehicles to the test at a regional competition held at the Kartsport track in Appleby. We've been working on these vehicles since April, and through perseverance, patience, and resilience, we managed to build an electric bike engineered and raced by the Year 6-7 girls, as well as a kart created by the Year 6-7 boys engineering group.

What a mission it was! The boys were determined they wanted to build a kart. After destroying a grass kart, a mobility scooter, and a bike and acquiring resources we finally put everything together to create a little machine! The judges were so impressed with our focus on sustainability that the boys received the Earth Care Award.

For the performance part of the competition, our vehicles had to complete 8 laps around the track. At first, the boys' kart was trailing in last place, but guess what? They ended up winning! When the scrutineers tested the battery consumption, the boys' kart only used 47%, while the other karts were well into the 70s. In this case, the tortoise really did win the race!

The boys got second place in engineering. At the end of the day, this programme wasn't just about winning awards. It was about the Universal design for learning... thinking, planning, designing, innovating, reflecting and sharing.

The teams were really buzzing. Congratulations LMS Royals and Granny Mobile.

AQUABOTS

Last Saturday, we had an exciting practice day with the Aquabots. We spent the day trialling a couple of different

courses to prepare for the upcoming competition. It was a great opportunity to test our robots and make adjustments before the big day.

Then, on Sunday, we returned for the actual competition. There were heaps of kids there, all putting their robots through their paces and competing in various challenges. Our school entered two teams, and we were proud to say we aced the obstacle course, thanks to the practice we did in our school

pool. The course involved moving items, taking caps and lids off objects, all while being timed. It was challenging but fun!

The competition was about more than just robotics; we also had to complete a quiz about Marine Reserves and participate in interviews where we answered questions related to the entire process. Throughout the day, we showed real resilience and perseverance. At one point, our robot broke, and the intermediate robot also experienced issues. But we quickly made emergency repairs, and both teams

managed to complete the last two tasks.

In the end, the intermediate team came 5th out of 23 teams, which was a fantastic result! And our Year 6 through resilience and perseverance earned first place!

Thanks to our hard work and determination, we are now heading to the nationals in Wellington! If we do well there and finish in the top three, we'll have the chance to compete internationally. We're proud of what we've achieved and excited for what's next!




